#### CT SBDC Program Regional Highlights

- Woodworking manufacturer serving large scale projects and direct to customer furnishings
- Direct to consumer manufacturer of storage units
- Manufacturer of custom metal products; start up by Veteran
- Retired Firefighter purchasing Peterbilt truck to start-up a small trucking company

#### seCTer Loan Program Highlights

- Received a \$1,760,000 Revolving Loan Fund Grant from the EDA; known as the CARES ACT RLF; the funding came with a mandate to have 50% advanced by 6/30/2021 and 100% by 6/30/2022. At 6/30/2021, 58% was advanced and 97% was approved and committed for funding.
- Provided technical assistance, modifications and deferrals to clients impacted by COVID. Several of our clients were able to thrive through the crisis, none of them failed.

#### Economic Development Highlights

- At 6/30/2021, seCTer had requested \$3,445,067 in state and federal grants and had received \$3,349,396.
- EDA approved the CARES ACT addendum to our current RLF Plan
- We applied to the EDA for De-Federalization of the Regional Revolving Loan Fund and the Small Business Loan Fund
- EDA approved the Grants Administration Grant for the CARES PPG Grant
- We hired a consultant and began the 2022 CEDS update process

The fiscal year ended 6/30/2021 was a challenging one for us and for our clients. It was a year of remote access, virtual meetings, drive by signings, distanced interactions (parking lots became offices and vehicle hoods, desks) and for some, isolation. Our staff faced down all challenges, "all ahead, full" and found great opportunities for us as a result.
